





April is contest month. At the April division meeting there will be a model contest and a photo contest. Start working on your model contest entries now.

We would like to see structures, rolling stock, and motive power. At the October contest there were no structures models entered whatsoever.

Remember, models do not have to be scratch-built. Kit-bashed models, craftsman-kit model, and highly super-detailed models are welcomed. All models must be accompanied by a contest entry form, which is available on the NMRA website.

First, second, and third prizes will be awarded in each category for which there are sufficient entries. Any model which receives 87.5 points or more will receive a Merit Award. Judging criteria can be found on the NMRA website. One of the judg-

ing criteria is Conformity. For those individuals hoping to earn a merit award, prototype photos and/or scale drawings should accompany the entry to maximize the points awarded for conformity.

There are four categories for entries in the photo contest: color model, color prototype, B&W model, and B&W prototype. Photos must be at least 5"x7" in size. However, photos of 8"x10" or 8.5"x11" are preferred. All photos must be mounted on mat material. Glass frames are not permitted. All photo entries must have been taken by the entrant and must have an entry form.



GETTING WIRED

LIGHTING BUILDINGS AND ACCESSORIES

There is considerable information regarding the powering of track and all its idiosyncrasies, but there is very little available about scenery lighting. So, let's dive in.

Just like track, buildings and other items (signals too!) require discipline in their wring. Yes, it is easy just to connect 12v to a light bulb, place it in a building and be done. That, however, can be a problem. Consider the burned-out bulb. If you don't provide a means of bulb replacement, the building will eventually be dark. Burned out bulbs have been the bane of layout lighting for years, and LED's are helping to reduce the fear of structure dissection to replace dead bulbs. LED's should last long enough to not be an issue.

That was easy – right? Just replace bulbs with LED's and all is well? Not really. You need to be careful how you do this. There are several ways you can accomplish the installation of LED's in buildings. Some of these approaches are



expensive, some are cheap, but all require some forethought.

I decided that all (and I do mean ALL) structure lighting on my layout will be 9 volts. This simplifies bench testing and wiring. (9v batteries are easy to use.) Of course, not all LED's run on 9V (OK, practically none!), so some voltage/ current reduction will be neces-

sary. This will likely require an assortment of resistors to verify that an LED will work under a 9v source. Resistors are cheap REALLY cheap! You can, with a bit of searching, find them for a penny each in quantities of 100 (try Jameco). So, buy an assortment... start with 500, 750, 1000, 1200, 1500 and 2000 ohms. That's a whopping \$6. There is a side benefit here. If you drop one, being inexpensive will likely reduce the amount of time you waste searching for it.

Some folks have fancy resistor selector boxes to test LED's, but being cheap, I just start testing the LED at 2000 ohms, and work my way down until I like the light output. Yes, you can calculate the voltage drop, but I usually use the old 'mark one eyeballs' to see if the brightness is about right. Many LED's are hyper efficient, so they need a bit of dimming anyway. LED's won't dim but within a certain range. To totally dim an LED you have to pulse the current – which is often way too much complexity for a building! Don't forget to keep the LED polarity correct to prevent the magic smoke!!!

Alright, you don't want to do all that? Well there are handy combo LED and power reducing assemblies available from some vendors that allow you to send whatever voltage (often 7-19v DC/ AC/DCC) on two leads (polarity is not an issue) to an attached LED. Those assemblies will



reduce and adjust the voltage to what the LED wants to eat. These devices are nice, but, as with anything, the convenience has its price. You might spend 2 or 3 dollars for each light, which can add up.

I have found Lights 4 Models (lights4models.com) on the internet has a good selection and lots of options. If you want to save bucks, check Digikey or Mouser for small LED's. If you do your own, you need to watch color temperature (2700K is about warm white, higher numbers get more blueish.)

Regardless of how you do this, you are going to have to connect the building wires to the layout. You should use some sort of plug, since you may want to move the building one day or test it on the bench before installation. I use what are called DuPont connectors, since they can be custom assembled, and they are tiny. Ready-made commercial connectors are available from many suppliers, but they can be expensive. The more price friendly DuPont pins and housings are available from Pololu electronics (www.pololu.com), Sparkfun (www.Sparkfun.com) and eBay/Amazon (for the more adventurous). This along with some good crimping pliers will allow you to make your own plugs/sockets easily (with practice). Insure you mark the polarity on your plugs and sockets... and as usual, don't ask me why I say that!

Have fun lighting those buildings, after all, those plastic people need to see at night!



Featured Member Layout: Alan Mole's Mole Valley Railroad





The first thing you notice when you enter Alan's layout room is the openness of his transition era model railroad. When he moved his existing layout to his new home, four foot extensions were added between the three peninsulas jutting into the space. This is further accentuated by the furniture-grade trestle table legs built by Morris Smith.

"The probability of moving was on my mind when I sold the G scale layout and moved inside to set up an On30 layout. The space in the old house was about 20' x 13' so I worked with Morris to make 5 modular tables that could be assembled and disassembled fairly easily."

His new 32' x 14' space was built to

accommodate the expanded layout. "I received great advice about the lighting, a combination of florescent and spot lights, and the power switches – one for lights the





other for the train! Even though it took about 5 months from storage to reassembly, I am very grateful for the support and great advice I received from my train buddies!!"

The level of detail is beyond impressive. Every scene tells a complete story about what is being modeled. Each activity being performed is well thought out draws the viewer into the scene. Building interiors—and

even caves carved into the rockface—are fully detailed and illuminated. Subtle humor can be discovered in many of the scenes.




Featured Member Layout: Alan Mole's Mole Valley Railroad
