


In Memoriam Scott Perry

Achievement Program NEWS

A Piedmont Division member recently contacted me by email saying that he was interested in earning the Model Railroad Engineer - Electrical AP Certificate. This would be his initial effort in

earning an AP certificate. He wanted to know how to get started. The following is the information I provided to him about

getting started. Perhaps this information will spur other members to work toward the Electrical Certificate.

The Electrial Engineer AP Certificate is a good place to start working on the NMRA's Achievement Program. It is the first certificate that I myself earned. Your first step should be to thoroughly read the information on that particular certificate on the NMRA website. Go to: www.nmra.org

Once you are in the website,

place your cursor on "Education" and select "Achievement Program". Then select "Categories" and look for "Engineering and Operation". Select "Model Railroad Engineer - Electrical". You will then see the complete requirements and hints about fulfilling these requirements. Near the end of the article is a paragraph entitled "Further Information". I highly recommend that you click on the link to "Model Railroad Engineer - Electrical". This particular write-up goes into detail on how to fulfill the requirements and provides examples of the required wiring diagrams.

Also on the NMRA website is a place to download the forms that must be completed. Once you have completed all the requirements and filled out the SOQ forms, you then submit the application to me. I review the application to make sure you have fulfilled all the requirements. I then contact you to arrange a visit so that I can check that all the electrical features are present on your layout and operational. I will then sign off on the application and forward it to the SER Achievement Program coordinator. As long as everything is proper on your application, a month or two later I should receive the certificate

> from the national office. The certificate will be presented to you at an upcoming Piedmont Division meeting.

> That's all there is to it. The Electrical Certificate is one of the most popular certificates in terms of the number that have been awarded to Piedmont Division members. Check out the spreadsheet on the Piedmont Division's website to see the names of all the division members who have earned the Electrical Certificate. The spreadsheet can be found in the

Achievement Program section.

I am always available to answer any questions that may arise and to provide any assistance you may need on working toward AP certificates.










A major feature on his layout is a large coal dock which is off-loading the beautifully crafted and weathered HENRY FORD II barge.

Jerry has created a spotting challenge to service the rail cars at this facility. He thoughtfully marked the cars with large numerals for those of us having eyes that also date from the


transition era.


