

'Unconventional' Convention Delivers Modeling Fun

It had been a dozen years since I last attended an NMRA national convention. With a more-flexible life schedule these days, it was time to end that drought.

There were some world-class layouts in the Detroit metro area that I'd long wanted to see in person. So it was that I headed up I-75 in July toward Novi, MI.

Given I'd waited fairly late to register (bad move, I know!), the main convention hotel was sold out. I settled on a nice, extended-stay hotel about 1.5 miles from the convention HQ hotel.

I count myself lucky. As the convention neared, registration was cut off cold after the hotel reached capacity. A note from convention organizers posted prominently near the registration desk explained why no more would-be attendees could be accommodated. The note's tenor suggested some complaints had been heard.

Moral – register early!

The 'unconventional' convention contained many familiar trappings, such as the usual clinics (127 were listed), layout and prototype tours and a large hall filled with modular layouts, vendors and SIG tables, etc. Some things were different, though, such as the lack of tour buses idling outside the host hotel. The

more than 60 layouts on display had to be accessed on your own.

The ones I saw were worth the drive. High among them was the late Bill Neale's spectacular, 1939 -era PRR layout, which his widow graciously kept in existence 18-plus months after Bill's passing. His friends have likely started removing it by now.

Mike Burgett's 1960s-era C&O and Dr. Bruce Chubb's famed Sunset Valley layouts likewise maintained a superlative modeling standard. There were many others of like quality, too.







If you see from the map


- that there are several members near you,







Farewell to Riverdale Station

A 40-year fixture in metro modeling closes its doors as its proprietor retires to Tennessee.

The little hobby shop near the Atlanta airport, Riverdale Station, has sold the last of its stock and has closed its doors. Proprietor **Bob Brennan**, who has operated the store at the same spot for over 30 years, is retiring from the retail trade, and will live with his son and his family in Tennessee.

Riverdale Station was known throughout the Southeast as "THE Hobby Shop for the Serious Modeler". Bob carried mostly HO locomotives, rolling stock, track and buildings, but perhaps what people came for mostly was the fantastic selection of detail parts, and of course, the excellent advice that Bob was usually happy to share with his fellow modelers. He also had a good selection of N scale trains and parts, as well as Lionel O gauge, and even, occasionally, G. Riverdale was also the last store in the Atlanta metro to regularly carry brass models.

"My first visit there was via while on an airline layover long before I moved to Atlanta," said division member **Andre Jackson**. "It was truly an old-school hobby shop. His overstuffed parts counters and the entire labyrinth of his backroom workshop are worthy of preservation in the NMRA museum or, heck, maybe even the Smithsonian."

"Bob is a skilled repairman and custom painter," he continued, "and he did some tricky repair work for me, at a quite-reasonable price."

"[The store] was a great source of spare parts for arcane items," he concluded. "The store cats (and dogs at times) were an added plus."

Bob's active participation in the hobby dates back to 1946, working on actually locomotives from when he was 12 years old.

During and after a career with Eastern Airlines, Bob worked at other hobby shops both in his home state of Pennsylvania, but later in the Atlanta area, opening his own store on Church Street in Riverdale in 1981.

In 1995, he moved the store to the Riverdale Plaza Shopping Center location that he's been at ever since.

Bob believes there is a future for model shops. "I'm not retiring because business is bad", he said. "Business is good, and sometimes even great. It's just that I'm getting old."

Bob plans to continue doing repairs and custom paint jobs for customers from his new home in Tennessee, and, especially, finally have time to attend all the train shows and other events that he couldn't go to before because the store came first.

Bob is a life-long member of the NMRA and has been very supportive of the Division, always buying ads as well as contributing to various projects over the years.

We are sorry to see you go, Bob, and we wish you all the best in retirement!

We say "hard-earned" because she experienced two in-flight emergencies during her training, plus she earned the money and paid for all her training, from private pilot, to instrument rated, to commercial, and now, CFI, on her own, some \$80,000. All, that is, expect for the final check ride, which her proud grand-dad paid for. She's now applying for instructor positions at her home field in Grand Junction, Colorado.
